

Chiles v. Fleming Island

On a clear chilly night in Orange Park, Florida, the Chiles Timberwolves lost 1 – 2 to the Fleming Island Eagles at the Eagles home field. Kickoff was at 7 p.m. Chiles' starting lineup was the following:

Chris Kessler and Jake Parker attended the captains meeting for Chiles

Fleming Island kicked off, but Chiles quickly drove the ball down to the Eagles side of the field early in the first period. In an early attempt at scoring, Derek Reed drove the ball towards the Fleming Island goal along the sideline. Derek passed to Jake Parker who passed to Cole Hoffman in the middle. The Eagles cleared this out the sideline. Jake Parker threw in and Derek Reed took a shot at 34:12 in the first period, but Fleming Island's keeper had the stop.

After Eagles' keeper cleared, a midfield ball control battle occurred. An Eagle midfielder ended the battle by launching the ball down to the Chiles side. Evan Cameron stopped this kick and cleared. Chris Kessler grabbed the ball and drove back down the sidelines towards the Eagle's goal. The Eagles cleared the ball out the sideline. Alex Schroepfer took the throw in, and, during a scoring attempt, Fleming Island fouled (hand ball) inside the box. Justin Dillenschneider takes the penalty kick and scores a GOAL with 31:54 to go in the first period.

Timberwolves 1 – Eagles 0

The game resumes when Fleming Island kicks off. After some play, the Eagles attempt another big kick down the length of the field to the Chiles goal. Evan Cameron makes the stop with 31:32 to go in the first. After Evan cleared, Chiles took the ball back down towards the Eagles goal. The Eagles cleared and the ball went back and forth and out of bounds several times near midfield. Alex Schroepfer and Nathan Eppinger each threw in. The Eagles eventually get a chance at the Timberwolves goal on a fast break, but Evan Cameron makes a stop with 28:46 to go in the first.

The Eagles gain control again and drive at Chiles' goal. A stop by Alex Schroepfer results in a corner kick by the Eagles. However, the corner sails past the Timberwolves' goal, and Fleming Island takes another shot from the far side which is stopped by Evan Cameron.

Evan clears and a fast break by Kent Deckerhoff to the Eagles' side results in a shot by Nicolai Modrow that misses over the top of the Eagles goal with 25:43 to go in the first. The Eagles drive back and shoot with 23:39 to go in the first which is stopped by Evan Cameron. After the clear, the Eagles gain control and take another shot with 22:41 to go that sails over the top of Chiles' goal. The Eagles take two more shots, one at 21:20 that Evan stops, and other at 19:11 that misses Chiles' goal.

The first period waterbreak occurs after which Cole Hoffman and Matt Salib sub into the game for Derek Reed and Colby Sowerby. After back and forth play, the Eagles shoot again at Chiles' goal which Evan Cameron stops with 12:33 to go. In another Eagles drive, Justin Dillenschneider makes a goal saving clear back to the Eagles side of the field.

Chiles gains advantage when Alex Schroepfer takes the ball up field and passes to Samuel Weeks who passes to Nicolai Modrow who takes at shot at the Eagles' goal with 5:38 to go in the first which Eagles defenders stop. The Eagles gain control back and shoot at 4:48, but Evan Cameron makes the stop. The Eagles also shoot at 3:44 which is also stopped by Evan.

Chiles substitutes in Bryan McBride and Joey Antworth for Jake Parker and Nicolai Modrow. With less than two minutes to go in the first, Chiles is called for a foul in the goal box. However, Evan Cameron makes an outstanding play and stops the resulting Eagles penalty kick. Great save Evan!

Chiles starts the following players for the second period:

Shortly after the beginning of the second period, the Eagles get a score with an assist and then a shot up the middle. Fleming Island then gets another score at 40:44 when Evan

attempts to stop a goal shot that comes out of a scrum around the Chiles goal and the officials determine the ball entered Chiles' goal. Luke Olsen comes in for Chiles.

Chiles 1 – Fleming Island 2

With 33:15 to go in the second, Nicolai Modrow takes a shot that misses to the side of the Eagle goal. Minutes later, Kent Deckerhoff takes a shot that misses over the top of the goal with 31:10 to go. Fleming Island then gains control and drives at Chiles' goal. A Fleming Island player collides with and kicks Evan Cameron in the stomach as Evan goes for the stop. The Fleming Island player receives a yellow card. However, Evan struggles with the injury and Taylor Kostrewa is sent in for Evan. Unfortunately, Evan lays injured on the sideline behind the Chiles goal for a while. We wish Evan a speedy recovery.

After further play, the Eagles get a fast break down the sideline. Alex Schroepfer takes out the breaking Eagles player, but Alex is called for a foul and given a redcard. Fortunately, Fleming Island misses the ensuing penalty kick over the top of Chiles' goal.

Chiles gains control and takes that ball back to the Eagles side. With 22:00 to go, Samuel Weeks takes a shot that just misses over the top of the Eagles goal. Chris Kessler also shoots with 21:39 to go but misses the goal. Daniel Campbell is substituted in for Luke Olsen.

After the water break, the Eagles take a shot at the Timberwolves goal with 19:15 to go in the second but the ball misses left. Chiles substitutes Conner Munro for Colby Sowerby. Chris Kessler shoots at 16:07, but the Eagles keeper makes the stop. Nicolai Modrow also takes a shot with 12:58 to go, but the Eagle keeper also stops this attempt.

Chiles' defense makes several key stops on fast breaks by Fleming Island. With less than two minutes to play, Fleming Island is called for a handball on their side of the field. But the Chiles free kick misses the Eagles' goal just to the left.

Final score Chiles 1 – Fleming Island 2

Although not victorious, the Timberwolves played with intensity. Chiles fans turnout in good numbers travelling all the way from Tallahassee at night to cheer on the team!
