

**Chiles v. Nease**

The Timberwolves defeated the Nease Panthers in a 2 – 1 in a come from behind victory at the Panther's field in St. Johns County, Florida. Kickoff occurred at 7:40 p.m. Timberwolves fans turned out in numbers for the match.

Jake Parker and Kent Deckerhoff represented Chiles at the captain's meeting.

Chiles starting lineup was announced as follows:

Chiles kicked off and immediately passed the ball back, switched around the field, and fed up far sideline toward Nease's side where Nease kicked it out. Jake Parker threw in and the ball bounced around in front of Nease's goal, but Chiles could not take the shot. Nease cleared.

Nease took the ball back to Chiles' side on the near sideline. Chiles kicks out. Nease throws in, and the ball bounces in front of Chiles' goal. Chiles' defenders cannot clear, and Nease heads it infor a goal with 38:10 to go in the first period.

Chiles 0 – Nease 1

Chiles kicks off and drives the ball down to Nease's side. The Panthers steal the ball away and drive back to midfield, but cannot advance further. A back and forth at midfield shows neither team gaining control. Finally, a Nease foul allows Samuel Weeks to take a free kick towards the Nease goal. Nease clears the ball out of bounds deep on the Panthers sideline. Jake Parker throws in, but Nease gains control and drives to the Chiles' side.

Nease drives along near side and attempts to center the ball, but Evan Cameron grabs the ball to prevent a goal shot. Quinton Williams and Daniel Campbell sub in for Chiles. With 15:09 to go, Samuel Weeks attempts a shot from midfield, but the ball sails over the

Nease goal. After further play, a Chiles foul gives Nease a free kick on the Chiles' side, but the ball launches up and over the top of Chiles' goal.

Chiles gains control and attempts to work up the near sideline. Quinton Williams feeds in to Chris Kessler who takes a shot that sails over the top of Nease's goal. Nease's keeper takes the goal kick from the far sideline and attempts to switch to the near side. But the keeper's kick is too soft, and the ball drifts in front of Nease's goal. Daniel Campbell seizes the opportunity to intercept the ball, drive up to the net, and shoot a GOAL with 4:20 to go in the first!

Chiles 1 – Nease 1

After the kickoff, a Nease shot bounces off Chiles' goal highbar, goes straight up, drops down, and Nease kicks it in. The Nease crowd celebrates, but the officials rule no goal because the ball was out over the top. Chiles gets one more shot before the half when Quinton Williams feeds to Chris Kessler who shoots but misses the goal to the left.

HALFTIME: Chiles 1 – Nease 1

The second period starts with Nease kicking off. But Chiles quickly controls and drives to the Nease side. Chris Kessler attempts a shot but misses over the top with 39:09 to go in the second. After the Nease keeper goal kick, Nease drives to the Chiles side where the ball bounces around in front of Chiles' goal. A Nease player tries to smack it in the goal, but Evan Cameron makes the stop.

A Chiles drive to the Nease goal results in a foul just outside the box. Samuel Weeks takes the free kick which a Nease defender blocks with his shoulder and the ball goes out the endline. The ball appears to go in, but the refs rule no goal. Cole Hoffman takes the corner and the ball bounces up and down in front of the goal with every player attempting a head. Nease clears it out.

Another Chiles drive results in a pass to the outside allowing Bryant McBride to shoot with 32:48 to go, but the Nease keeper stops. Further play produces a Chiles drive up the middle where Chris Kessler takes a shot that is also stopped by the Nease keeper at 30:10 in the second. Derek Reed subs in for Bryan McBride. Nathan Eppinger also comes in for Jake Autrey.

Further play results in no clear control by either side, although the ball is on the Nease side for a slight majority of the time. Joey Antworth comes into the game. Chiles steps up the intensity of play.

Cole Hoffman shoots with 24:30 to go which the Nease keeper stops. A Chiles throw in on the far side also gives Chris Kessler a shot that misses to the right at 23:45. Nease drives to Chiles' side and a corner kick results. Nease gets a big shot on the corner, but Evan Cameron make nice catch for the stop.

Nicolai Modrow comes in for Kent Deckerhoff. Daniel Campbell shoots towards the top of the goal that the Nease keeper stops with 21:40 to go. Derek Reed, Chris Kessler and Alex Schroepfer pass back and forth until Alex shoots but misses to the right with 17:43 to go. Matt Salib comes in for Joey Antworth.

Matt attempts a shot that sails over the top with 3:54 to go. Conor Munro attempts to set up a shot with 3:41 to go, but the Nease defenders make the stop. Conor goes down in a collision with a Nease player, but gets up and going under his own power.

On a subsequent corner kick by Chiles, the Nease keeper appears to interfere with a Chiles player. The refs stop the game briefly, and yellow card the Nease keeper causing him to come out of the game. Nease does not appear to have a backup keeper, and subs in another player in a red practice jersey. When play resumes, Chiles drives in from the far sideline, Samuel Weeks centers the ball, and Matt Salib kicks the game winning GOAL!

Chiles 2 – Nease 1

The intense and up tempo play by the Timberwolves seals the victory in the second period.
