

PRESEASON
CHILES v. RICKARDS

The Chiles High Varsity 2009-2010 season began with a 5 – 0 preseason match victory over the Rickards High School Raiders at the Lincoln High stadium on Friday, November 06, 2009. Kickoff for this game was at 5:30 p.m. with the setting sun. There was good fan turnout to support the Timberwolves!

Jake Parker and Chris Kessler represented the Timberwolves at the captains' meeting.

Chiles starting lineup was as follows:

Rickards kicked off, but Chiles quickly won control and kept the ball on the Rickards side of the field for most of the game. Early in the game, Colby Sowerby attempted a shot but missed. Nicolai Modrow also attempted a header shot but missed.

After a Rickards throw-in, Derek Reed worked hard in the midfield and upfield area and regained control. A Rickards penalty allows Samuel Weeks to take a free kick at goal, but Rickards' keeper makes the save.

Ten or so minutes into the first period, Rickards advanced the ball to the Chiles side of the field. However Justin Dillenschneider made a stop, and cleared back to the Rickards side. Jake Parker then took the ball upfield. A quick pass allowed Kent Deckerhoff to shoot but missed. Jake Parker also shoots which Rickards' keeper stopped.

After more play, Chris Kessler and Jake Parker fought Rickards defenders and midfielders and gained control of the ball at midfield. A pass up the center allowed Jake Parker to attempt a goal. However, offside was called.

After further play, Kent Deckerhoff took a shot, but this was stopped by Rickards' keeper. Rickards' keeper cleared. Chiles gained control. Nathan Eppinger passed to Nicolai Modrow who passed to Jake Parker. Jake Parker shoots and scores a GOAL with 21:56 remaining in the first period!

Chiles 1 – Rickards 0.

Luke Olsen is substituted in with 18:13 to go in the first period. Play resumes. Rickards drives the ball to the Chiles side, but Alex Schroepfer clears to midfield. The Timberwolves work the ball towards Rickards' goal. Chris Kessler takes a shot which Rickards' keeper saves with 17:18 left in the first period.

During a defensive stop, Chiles commits a penalty resulting in a Rickards free kick on the Chiles side of the field. Chiles defenders block this free kick. Evan Cameron grabs the ball and clears to midfield. The Timberwolves take control at midfield and drive towards the Raiders goal. Kent Deckerhoff passes to Nicolai Modrow who shoots a GOAL with 13:06 to go in the first period!

Chiles 2 – Rickards 0.

After further play, Chris Kessler passed to Nicolai Modrow who passed to Ken Deckerhoff who took a shot that bounced off the Rickards' goal post. Chris Kessler then took a shot that went wide. The Timberwolves regain control after the goal kick, and drive downfield. The ball goes out on Rickards. Jake Parker throws in to Nicolai Modrow who shoots a GOAL with 2:38 to go in the first period!

Chiles 3 – Rickards 0.

The second half starts with the following Timberwolves taking the field for Chiles:

Chiles kicked off. After some midfield play, Chiles drives to the Rickards goal and Josh Waller shoots but misses with 38:20 to go in the second. When play resumes an intense struggle occurs near the Chiles side of the midfield area. Jake Autrey and two Rickards players collide mid-air with Quinton Williams. Quinton goes down. Play stops and the coaches come on the field. Quinton soon got up and off the field, but suffered a concussion. We wish Quinton a speedy recovery.

Play resumes. Luke Olsen and Daniel Campbell come in for Chiles with 31:34 to go in the second. During midfield play, Samuel Weeks passed to Colby Sowerby who passed

to Luke Olsen. Luke centered the ball to Cole Hoffman who passed to Daniel Campbell who takes a shot that is stopped by the Rickards keeper with 30:23 to go in the second.

Joey Antworth comes in for Chiles with 28:32 to go in the second. During a Rickards throw-in, Conner Munro steals the ball and takes a shot at goal but the ball sails wide. Further play results in a corner kick for Chiles, but the ball sails wide past the goal and out of bounds. Ali Farsi and Porter Watson come in for Chiles with 24:09 to go in the second.

With 22:50 to go, Bryant McBride takes a shot that is stopped by the Rickards keeper. Chiles grabs the ball after the Rickards' keeper clears, and feeds down the sidelines. Luke Olsen passes to Cole Hoffman who takes a shot that results in a GOAL with 22:12 to go in the second!

Chiles 4 – Rickards 0.

Rickards kicked off, but Chiles quickly won control. Luke Olsen fed to Daniel Campbell who shoots but is stopped by Rickards' keeper. Further play results in a Rickards goal shot that Porter Watson stops. Chiles subs in Dylan Farrell in with 17:47 to go in the second.

A Raider throw-in produced a Rickards drive that Samuel Weeks cleared. Chiles drove the ball down and Joey Antworth shot from the right side which went out on the Rickards keeper. Cole Hoffman took the corner, but Rickards cleared. Jake Autrey stole the ball back at midfield and passed to Conner Munro. Conner passed to Daniel Campbell who shoots a GOAL with 14:00 to go in the second!

Chiles 5 – Rickards 0.

Further play results in a Rickards goal attempt that Porter Watson stops again at 10:52 to go in the second. Porter cleared, and the play varied back and forth between the Chiles and Rickards side of the field. Daniel Campbell passes to Luke Olsen who shoots from the right side of the field, but misses to the left with 4:23 to go. Conner Munro also takes a shot on goal at 3:59 but misses over the top.

Rickards drives back for one last attempt at 2:00, but Porter Watson again stops. Daniel Campbell drives the ball down the sideline and passes to Luke Olsen to head in the goal, but Chiles is called offside.

The game ends at 7:13 PM. The final score: CHILES 5 – RICKARDS 0!

The Timberwolves look impressive for their first outing. The conditioning and training at practice clearly pay off. Chiles awaits the winner of the Leon v. Lincoln match.
